#### **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

The 17th Judicial District VALE Board is authorized to enter into contracts with persons or agencies the Board deems appropriate for the purchase and coordination of services to crime victims. These contracts are determined through a competitive grant process. Grant applications are accepted and evaluated related to the provision of services delineated pursuant to C.R.S. § 24-4.1-303 and 304 and for the implementation of the rights afforded to crime victims pursuant to C.R.S. § 24-4.1-302.5. Grant funded services must be designated for services to victims / witnesses of crime who reside and /or were victimized in Adams and Broomfield counties (17th Judicial District).

Grant funds shall not be used for defraying the costs of routine and ongoing operating expenses. Grant funds shall not be used to supplant existing funds for personnel and /or operating expenses. Grant funding is not guaranteed because an applicant meets eligibility requirements, proposes services listed as a funding priority, is currently receiving or has in the past received, these grant funds.

#### PRIORITY FUNDING CONSIDERATIONS

The VALE Board gives priority consideration to criminal justice and non-profit community based agencies serving victims of crimes in both Adams and Broomfield counties that provide:

- **1.** <u>Statutorily mandated services</u> pursuant to C.R.S. §24-4.1-302.5 (VRA) implementing the rights afforded to crime victims.
- 2. <u>Direct services to victims</u> as delineated in C.R.S. §§24-4.1-303 and 304 and §24-4.2-105(4) related to all crimes as defined by C.R.S. §24-4.1-302(1).
- **3.** Establish and/or enhance the **coordinated**, **collaborative delivery of direct services for victims of V R A crimes** provided by non-profit community based and criminal justice based victim services in the 17<sup>th</sup> Judicial District.
- THE 17<sup>th</sup> JD VALE BOARD UTILIZES A COMPETITIVE GRANT PROCESS. Equal consideration is given to current 17<sup>th</sup> Judicial District VALE grant recipients and new grant applicants for funding determinations.
- VALE funds are not intended to be the sole or primary source of initial or ongoing funding for direct victim service personnel positions and operating expenses.
- Funding consideration is given, <u>as funds are available</u>:
  - To agencies providing services designed to support the activities of direct victim service providers and /or positively impact the delivery of direct victim service;
  - For purchase and /or lease of technical equipment directly related to the immediate individual physical safety of crime victims;
  - For registration fees and expenses for lodging, travel, and meals of <u>in-state</u> training programs <u>specifically directed toward delivery of services to crime victims</u> and for the actual cost of

o providing the necessary staff training directly related to the implementation of the rights afforded to crime victims pursuant to C.R.S. §24-4.1-302.5 and the provision of services delineated pursuant to C.R.S. §§24-4.1-303 and 24-4.1-304.

#### **ANTICIPATED AMOUNT AVAILABLE**

\$1,400,000.00 is projected to be available for the 12 month grant cycle of January 1 through December 31, 2020.

In 2019, the 17<sup>th</sup> Judicial District VALE Board awarded a total of \$1,270,286.00 to 32 agencies in Adams and Broomfield counties. The grant funding cycle of January 1 through December 31, 2020 is dependent upon the collections made in 2020. The amount of available funds for grant allocation can be impacted by multiple factors and may be different each year. **Please Note:**There will not be a separate application for training or scholarships so those requests should be included in this application.

#### **GRANT FUNDING CRITERIA**

The 17<sup>th</sup> JD VALE Board conducts an open, fair, impartial and equitable award process of receiving, reviewing, evaluating and voting on all grant applications in accordance with statutory guidelines and standards requirement and intended uses for these funds.

Funding criteria include, but are not limited to:

- The degree to which it is determined that the grant application meets state and local requirements regarding intended use of funds, with consideration for the geography, population, need and available resources specific to the 17<sup>th</sup> Judicial District;
- Assessment of the grant applicant's ability to meet financial and administrative requirements related to grant fund management as well as organizational capacity to provide services in the 17<sup>th</sup> Judicial District as proposed in the application;
- The quality of the grant proposal including the accuracy and completeness of the information provided in the application and timeliness of application submission;
- Ability of the 17<sup>th</sup> Judicial District VALE fund to meet existing unpaid obligations in the future prior to making new financial commitments.

#### **PLEASE NOTE:**

- Factors other than stated in this RFP may be utilized to make funding determinations.
- Projects not designated in the priority funding considerations may be awarded grant funds.

#### RECONSIDERATION REQUESTS

The 17<sup>th</sup> Judicial District VALE Board reserves the right to reject any or all grant applications, to waive informalities and minor irregularities in the grant applications received, and to approve any portion of the grant application or all items of the grant application, if deemed in the best interest of the 17<sup>th</sup> Judicial District to do so. After the initial funding determinations are made, written reconsideration requests may be submitted only if 50% or more of the funding requested in the grant application was denied.

The agency must notify the VALE Board, in writing, of their intent to submit a written Reconsideration Request within thirty (30) days of the date noted on the letter of denial. When submitted, the written reconsideration request must include:

- 1) <u>Additional information</u> directly related to Grant Funded Project / Personnel that was not available as of August 19, 2019; OR
- 2) <u>Information demonstrating a significant change</u> <u>in circumstances</u> directly related to the Grant Funded Project / Personnel <u>that has taken place since</u> August 19, 2019.

Written Reconsideration Requests will be reviewed by the Board at a meeting scheduled during the week of November 4, 2019. Written notification of the VALE Board's 2020 funding determinations, including denials or reductions, will be emailed to all grant applicants within ten (10) working days after this meeting. Funding determinations made by the Board at this time are final.
